## Travel Information

We recommend that you fly into Lyon-Saint Exupéry Airport. From U.S., Canada, and some other countries you can fly into any major European hub and from there get a connecting flight to Lyon. From Lyon-Saint Exupéry Airport take the tram/train called the Rhone Express (a red train) to Lyon-Part-Dieu train station. Follow the many signs for the Rhone Express in the airport. Red Kiosques to buy tickets are before you exit airport. We are emphasizing Lyon-Part-Dieu train station (Gare in French) because there are several train stations in Lyon and you have to come to Gare de Lyon-Part-Dieu in order to take the train to Le Puy. The same applies for St Etienne-Chateaucieux train station. The city of St Etienne has four train stations and the correct one for you, should you need to transfer trains, is St Etienne-Chateaucieux. You will not change stations in St Etienne, only trains if you do not have a direct train to Le Puy from Paris or Lyon-Part-Dieu.
